1. CALL TO ORDER

3. KENNEDY/JENKS ENGINEERINGSERVICES PRESENTATION

Chris Kelsey, P.E., Kennedy/Jenks

Chris Kelsey reviewed the following key items:

Shifted Focus

- Capital Costs, Operational Costs and Infrastructure Replacement Costs
 - District Wells
 - Seattle Public Utilities
 - Lakehaven Utility District

Scope Elements - Alternatives Analysis

- Intial Evaluation of 3 Sources
 - Capital facilities necessary for Lakehaven costs developed.
 - Operation costs include power, chemicals, maintenance, labor.
 - Develop infrastructure facility replacement cost.
- Analyze Select Improvements at Des Moines WTP
 - Fluoridation, chlorine system conversion, backup power.
- Portfolio Analysis
 - Spreadsheet-based tool.
- Document in an Evaluation Report

Scope Elements – Wheeling to Tukwila/CWA?

- Rate Setting Review
 - Updated capital facilities program from recent Water System Plan.
 - Add capital projects to support the preferred portfolio.
 - Structure modification necessary?
- Wholesaling Evaluation Tukwila
 - Develop capital/operational costs for intertie.
 - Develop infrastructure replacement cost for shared facilities.



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Document in a technical memorandum.

Project Assumptions

- Evaluation report would not qualify as a project report for any design facility.
- Key data readily available in organized format from the District.
- · Full code review of Des Moines WTP not included.
- No water quality or hydraulic modeling.
- Future purchased water cost escalation based on best available information.

5. LANE VS. CITY OF SEATTLE (HYDRANT BILLING ISSUE)

John Milne, Inslee, Best, Doezie & Ryder, P.S.

The General Manager and the attorney reported to the Board on a recent decision by the Washington State Supreme Court where the Court had confirmed that the City of Seattle could not recover the costs of fire hydrants which were part of Seattle's water system from its retail water customers. Rather, Seattle was required to pay for fire hydrants out of its general fund. In the Lane case, Seattle had imposed a tax on its water utility, SPU, to pay for fire hydrants and had also billed cities where Seattle maintained water facilities. The Court had upheld the utility tax and the billings to the cities involved in the case. The General Manager and the attorney will further review the decision and advise whether the case decision has any application to water districts.

6. OTHER

Commissioner Quonq-Vermeire

Kathleen said the WASWD Board passed a Code of Ethics without having a legal opinion regarding conflicts of interests.

Kathleen attended the Washington WARN Conference in Denver, Colorado. Kathleen said Washington is one of only two states that have not implemented WARN.

Kathleen informed the Board and staff that House Bill 2249 was introduced at the Regular Legislative Session on 2/18/09. The ACT relates to modifying local government revenue options in 2 counties with a population of one million five hundred thousand or 3 more; amending RCW 82.14.415, 82.14.030, 84.55.050, and 82.14.450; 4 reenacting and



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amending RCW 82.46.035; adding a new section to chapter 5 35.21 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 35A.82 RCW; adding a new 6 section to chapter 43.09 RCW; adding a new chapter to Title 36 RCW; 7 creating a new section; and providing expiration dates.
