6. STAFF / COMMISSIONERS / ATTORNEY INPUT Matt Everett

Matt reviewed the following item(s) from the General Manager's Report of 5/20/09:

- Matt informed the Board that the District received a refund (\$5,002.45) on their L & I premiums from WASWD as a member of the Retrospective Rating Group.
- Matt distributed to the Board a copy of his letter to the City of Des Moines Council and City Manager commenting for a second time on the District's objections to the City's Proposed Ordinance 09-22 – Pavement Mitigation Fee. The City agreed in principle to some small concessions (add language in the City ordinance to waive the fee if a full or half-street overlay is required). The ordinance may go before the council again in the Fall of 2009 with the changes the City Council proposed.
- General Manager's Contract Extension John Milne explained to the Commissioners that the Board must respond in writing to Matt by June 30, 2009 stating their intentions regarding his employment at the District. The Board can agree to renew or not renew the General Manager's contract or negotiate a new contract. John Milne recommended the Board go into executive session at the 6/23/09 Workshop meeting to discuss their options.
- Project 07-2 McMicken Heights Groundwater Treatment Facility Matt and Jeremy are working with the City of Seatac on the land swap. The City of Seatac will bring this to their Council in June. Matt said the City permitting process would be lengthy which could potentially push construction of the project out until Spring of 2010.

Kathleen Quong-Vermeire

- Kathleen informed the Commissioners and staff that she would be attending the AWWA National Conference in San Diego, CA. Commissioner Guite will also attend the conference.
- Kathleen informed the Board of an Emergency Planning seminar for elected officials on May 27, 2009 from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 pm at the King County Emergency Coordination Center.

John Milne

 Lane vs. SPU- The Court ruled that SPU could not charge ratepayers for hydrant costs. Instead, the City of Seattle is supposed to tax its citizens for these costs. John will research the ruling to determine the potential affect on Highline Water District in the future. John will prepare an opinion letter and update the Board and staff at a future Board meeting.

 Debbie informed the Board that the 2008 Annual Report for the State Auditor would be on the 5/26/09 Workshop meeting agenda for review and discussion.
