- Matt and the Board received special recognition awards from WASWD at the conference held in Chelan, Washington.
- Enduris Insurance – Matt informed the Board that the premiums would decrease for a second consecutive year because of the District's positive claims history.
- Draft Permit No ST-7445: Reclaimed Water Permit for King County Wastewater Treatment Division, South Plant - Matt distributed a copy of a letter from Cedar River Water and Sewer District to the Department of Ecology expressing their objections of the DOE's issuance of this permit to the extent it "specifically authorizes the South WWTP to distribute Class A reclaimed water from the existing water reclamation facility to off-site users" in order for "the county [to act] as a water supplier to distribute reclaimed water off-site for irrigation, commercial and industrial uses."

Commissioner Koester made a motion to authorize the General Manager to write a letter to the Water Quality Permit Coordinator with the Department of Ecology, expressing the same objections as Cedar River Water and Sewer District. After discussion, the motion was seconded by Commissioner Guite and carried unanimously.

Jeremy DelMar

- Project 07-2 McMicken Heights Groundwater Treatment Plant – Jeremy and Mary submitted a request (9/21/09) for a 6-month extension of the Public Works Trust Fund Pre-Construction Loan.

Debbie Prior

- King County Items:

(1) King County Investment Pool has opted to restructure the impaired Victoria Fund for a potential 50 to 70% recovery over a 6-year period. A class action lawsuit has been filed against the rating company and the Cheney Investment Group.

(2) King County has chosen a new banking partner (U.S. Bank). The deadline for switching from Key Bank is 12/31/09. King County is working on a new fee structure and may raise fees for cash management.
