**WHEREAS**, the United States Congress passed and on March 18, 2020, President Trump signed into law the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) requiring employers to provide emergency family sick leave and emergency family medical leave for employees affected by coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, the benefits of the FFCRA take effect April 2, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the District must comply with the new federal law.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. The District adopts the requirements of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act.
- 2. The General Manager or designee is authorized to modify the District Codebook and other related policies and procedures, as necessary, to comply with the new federal law.
- 3. The General Manager or designee is authorized to apply for any applicable tax credit or financial benefit resulting from the enactment of the new law as deemed appropriate.
