6. STAFF/COMMISSIONERS/ATTORNEY Jeremy DelMar

- 6.1 <u>Project 14-1 Comprehensive Water System Plan</u> Financial Consulting Services Group (FCSG) will give a presentation of the financial component at the 1/26/16 Board Workshop.
- 6.2 <u>Request for Proposals</u> Jeremy discussed the recommendation to award the design contract to RH2 Engineering for Pump Station No. 8 and discussed soliciting interviews from two of the four submittals for the Mansion Hill Reservoir Relocation project. The District will interview Gray & Osborne and Stantec in early February.
- 6.3 <u>Project 14-3 Manhattan View Water Main Replacement</u> The City of Normandy Park proposed that the District pay a fee for the City to assume responsibility for the road restoration. The Board was in agreement for staff to prepare an agreement with the City. The District will advertise for bids in February.
- 6.4 <u>Vehicle Theft</u> On 1/14/16 a District service truck (#69) was stolen from the headquarters site. The City of Kent Police department was given a copy of the security video. The truck has not been recovered. Enduris Insurance has been notified of the incident.

- 6.5 <u>2015 HWD Monthly Water Supply vs Water Sales</u> The unaccounted for water was slightly over 11%. The District believes that a portion of the water loss is due to Seattle's meter over registering. The City has been informed of the District's concerns with the meter.
- 6.6 <u>SB 6115 Utility Tax Cap</u> The WASWD Government Relations Committee was unanimous in not supporting the bill at this time.
- 6.7 <u>City of Des Moines Proposed Utility Tax on Water Bills</u>

Commissioners' Johnson and Fultz reported on their recent discussion with the City of Des Moines Mayor, Matt Pina, and Mayor Pro-tem, Vic Pennington, regarding the City's desire to add a utility tax on the District's water rate revenue. They stated the City may be interested in negotiating a short-term (approximately 5 years) franchise agreement with the District which would include a more reasonable tax, less than the 16% and 11% rates previously discussed. They hope to reach an agreement within the next four months at the latest.

6.8 HB 1047 State Agencies-Continuity Of Operations Plan (effective date 7/24/15)
Commissioner Quong-Vermeire recommended the Board review HB 1047 which places responsibility on each state agency for developing an organizational continuity of operations plan that is updated and exercised annually in compliance with the program for interagency coordination of continuity of operations planning.
